

ACTUAL RESERVATION FOR OBCs IN IIT, IIM, NIT, AIIMS ETC. IS 42%

As per clause 5 (l) of “The Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in admission) Act 2006 each institute has to increase/enhance 54% seats to implement 27% OBC reservation by maintaining earlier 77% Unreserved (General) Seats.

Note- (1) OBCs will get 27% seats of this 154 seats which comes to 42.
(2) OBCs admitted by reservation in a class of 100 students will be 42.

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 3rd January, 2007, and is hereby published for general information:—

THE CENTRAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION) ACT, 2006

No. 5 OF 2007

[3rd January, 2007.]

5. (l) Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (iii) of section 3 and in any other law for the time being in force, every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority, increase the number of seats in a branch of study or faculty over and above its annual permitted strength so that the number of seats, excluding those reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes, is not less than the number of such seats available for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this Act.

Mandatory increase of seats.
